

The TVET Sector Support Programme (SSP) supports achieving sustainable development goals in areas such as promoting inclusive and sustainable economic growth, employment and decent work for all. The Programme focuses on skills development, which presents an opportunity to reassert TVET's role in the 2030 sustainable development agenda.

qualifications for Competency Based Training & Assessment (CBT&A)

- Issuance of national certificates to 15,000 skilled persons from the informal sector through Recognition of Prior Learning
- Establishment of employer-led Institute Management Committees in 500 TVET institutes
- Implementation of the national TVET Policy at federal and provincial or regional level
